Barbara A. Morrongiello, PhD

Professor of Clinical Psychology
University of Guelph

Barbara A. Morrongiello is a Professor in clinical Psychology at the University of Guelph. Her research focuses on identifying key factors that elevate children's risk of unintentional injury and developing evidence-based programs to reduce children's risk of injury.

One of her areas of research is the use of Motivational Interviewing in the field of Injury Prevention.

Pat Bishop's research interests have focused on head and spine injuries, protective equipment, and epidemiology of injuries that occur in sports, work environments and when individuals are driving.

His talk will include a brief history of Closed Head Injury, the mechanism of concussion regardless of activity, how to recognize a concussion, and how to treat a concussion.
