



ONTARIO'S DRINKING AND DRIVING LAW HAS CHANGED.

Starting May 1, 2009, even a couple of drinks could mean an immediate licence suspension.

If you've been drinking and your blood alcohol concentration registers from .05 to .08 on a roadside breath test, you will lose your driver's licence for 3 to 30 days.

Drivers caught more than once face mandatory alcohol education programs and ignition interlock.
